## PLASTIC BAGS AND OVERWRAP



Outer bags and product wraps

- Bags for groceries, produce, dry bulk foods, frozen vegetables, water softener, salt, garden products, newspapers, etc.
- Overwrap for diapers, feminine hygiene products, paper towels, soft drink flats

### NOT ACCEPTED Do NOT place into Blue Box





- \* Non-paper gift wrap, foil wrap, cards or paper with glitter
- \* Padded envelopes
- Bags and boxes with foil liners \* Paper towels, napkins and tissues
- \* Rubber bands, ribbons, bows
- \* Foil or plastic lined paper bags

### **NO HAZARDOUS MATERIALS**

Exclude batteries; medical sharps: bleach or aerosol containers with any contents remaining; containers with the words COMBUSTIBLE. FLAMMABLE or VERY FLAMMABLE on them (except cosmetic and beauty product containers); compressed gas cylinders, for example used propane cylinders; containers for paint, motor oil, vehicle lubricants, or antifreeze; or containers for pesticides with the words DANGER, WARNING or POISON, and precautionary octagon or diamond symbols


